There will be a net creation of 125 posts and an additional provision of \$85.1 million (13.7% increase) under this programme in 2007-08 for enhancing food safety and public health efforts. In this connection, please advise on:

- 1. the ranks, functions and responsibilities of these new posts; and
- 2. how the new resources will be allocated. Please quantify the additional work or services, list the relevant performance indicators and the percentage of the allocation.

Reply:

- 1. The net 125 posts to be created in 2007-08 are posts relating to the grades of Chemist, Field Officer, Health Inspector, Pest Control Assistant, Pest Control Officer, Science Laboratory Technician, Scientific Officer (Medical) and Veterinary Officer as well as administrative support posts. Their functions/responsibilities are to perform food safety regulatory functions and provide pest control services.
- 2. The increase in 2007-08 estimated expenditure under this programme is mainly to cater for the following
 - (a) creation of posts and departmental expenses in relation to enhancement of food safety regulatory functions and pest control services (\$67.2 million);
 - (b) increased capital expenditure such as population-based food consumption survey, integrated mass spectrometer system (\$8.7 million); and
