## Question:

Is there any assessment of any tendency of reducing occupancy rate of market stalls? Any measures to enhance the competitiveness of public market and how much expenditure will be involved?

Asked by: Hon. WONG Yung-kan

## Reply:

We expect that changes in shopping habits of the community and increasing competition from private retail outlets will continue to adversely affect the occupancy rate of public markets.

To enhance the competitiveness of public markets, the Department has been carrying out general improvement works (including upgrading of drainage, lighting, ventilation, signage and fire services provision) in the markets. In 2007-08, improvement works will be carried out in 10 markets at a cost of about \$103 million. To improve the shopping environment and atmosphere in public markets, the Department will continue to implement the following measures:

- (a) maintaining a high standard of cleanliness in markets and the enforcement of the monthly market cleansing day;
- (b) maintaining flexibility in determining and changing the trade of individual stalls, and where feasible, the stall size;
- (c) merging of selected vacant small stalls to form larger stalls and lowering, in selected markets, the upset auction prices of long-standing vacant stalls to attract potential bidders; and

(d)	conducting	promotional	activities	(such	as	lucky	draws,	talks	and
	exhibitions)	and distributing	ng regular r	narket r	news	sletters 1	to attract	custon	ners.

The resources required for the above measures will be absorbed within the Department's allocation.
