Question:

Regarding the food samples taken for testing, the Department estimates that the figure for 2008 will be similar to that for 2007, which are 65 000 and 65 206 respectively. However, in view of the spread of viruses on a global scale, did the Department take any measures to enhance the safety of imported food? If yes, please advise on the details, and the manpower and expenditure involved.

Reply:

A proactive three-tier approach involving routine, targetted and seasonal food surveillance has been adopted since 2007. In planning the food surveillance programme, various factors including the risk of food items, consumption level, past surveillance data, and previous local/overseas food incidents are taken into consideration. In 2008, the Centre for Food Safety will maintain this approach. The estimated expenditure on food surveillance is \$45.4 million. The manpower involved is 96 staff, including health inspectors, administration and supporting staff.
