What are the reasons for the considerable increase on both counts? Please advise on the respective manpower and expenditure involved for the years concerned.

## Reply:

To further improve the effectiveness of rodent control work, we made a wider use of poison treatments and rodent trappings in 2009. Hence the increase in both numbers in 2009 over 2008.
