Under this programme, it is mentioned the number of food complaints handled by the Department in 2012 was 5 261, which was higher than the corresponding figure of 4 265 in 2011. Please advise on the following:

- (a) the type and nature of food complaints handled in the past three years (i.e. in 2010, 2011 and 2012), as well as the examination results and outcomes of these complaints;
- (b) whether the Department has assessed the reason(s) for the significant increase in the number of food complaints; and
- (c) in view of the rising number of food complaints, whether additional manpower and resources will be deployed or special measures be taken to handle the complaints.

Reply:

The information sought is provided as follows -

(a) The number of food complaints handled by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department from 2010 to 2012 with breakdown by nature is provided in the following table -

(b) The increase in the number of food complaints in 2012 was attributed to growing public awareness of food safety and food labelling issues as well as the occurrence of a number of food incidents in 2012. Examples include the case of low iodine content in infant formulae that came to light in August, the case of aquatic products suspected to be tainted with plastic pellet in August, and the case of suspected substandard cooking oil in December.
