The inspection work of food animal and fish farms outside Hong Kong is covered by an inspection unit in the Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department. That unit comprises 3 veterinary officers, 8 field officers and 1 fisheries officer. The actual expenditure was \$9.4 million in 2015-16 and \$10.5 million in 2016-2017. The revised estimate of expenditure in 2017-18 is \$11.7 million.

The inspection of vegetable farms, orchards and food processing plants outside Hong Kong is carried out by other units in CFS which are tasked with other duties as well. These units include officers such as an agricultural officer and 5 health inspectors. CFS does not have
