The expenditure incurred by the Department in providing cemeteries and crematoria services, including the service for scattering of ashes at sea and in Gardens of Remembrance, in 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 was \$327.4 million, \$332.5 million, \$345.6 million, \$355.4 million and \$407.6 million (revised estimate) respectively. There is no separate breakdown of the expenditure by type of service.

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
